

CETP Basic Principles and Practices of Propane is the required entry-level course that provides introductory instruction required for all new industry workers and is the prerequisite for subsequent CETP modules.

Basic Principles and Practices introduces students to: propane's physical and combustion properties; identifying propane industry standards; how propane is produced and transported; safety codes and regulations; identifying basic parts of tanks; cylinders, fittings, and storage installations; maintaining a safe working environment; and more. This course will aid in preparing for CETP certification.

Space is limited at some locations. Register today and make sure you receive this required training!

What to expect: Students will take quizzes and tests to assess their pace of learning. A multiple-choice test will be administered at the end of the class.

Tests are graded by a third party and the results are mailed to each company. Registrants must be in attendance for the entire session. A score of 70% or higher is required to pass the test. **Tests will not be graded until the class is paid in full.**

NFPA 58 requires both initial and subsequent refresher training to be documented.

Registration includes: the cost of student and test materials, pencils, markers, and other materials. Lunch and refreshments are also provided. Other meals, lodging and travel are not included in the class fee.
